President's Alley

Recently you may have noticed dozens of happy kids in large group lessons on the HydroCourts and wondered what was going on. They were participants in one of the Chicago Park District's summer camps. Part of LPTA's unique relationship with the Park District includes the commitment and obligation to support programs that bring tennis to the broader community. We consider it part of our mission to promote the joy of tennis to those in our community who might not otherwise be exposed to it.

This commitment is part of our contract with the Park District. A quick summary of our agreement is that we pay annual rent to the Park District for both the Diversey courts and the parking area. Six courts are designated for member use and four courts are designated for public use. LPTA is responsible for operating and maintenance costs for all 10 courts. These costs are partially offset by the revenue from the public courts, the balance is covered by member dues.

In addition to those basic responsibilities, our contract requires us to offer and support various types of community programming. Dee is our point person with the Park District for scheduling and supporting these various programs, and she does a great job of balancing the needs of the members with those of the programs. In addition to Park District camp programs, we are involved with Chicago-area TOPS (Tennis Opportunity Program), Move Your Feet Sports, the Chicago District Tennis Association (part of USTA), and Chicago Sport and Social. In short, LPTA is more than a tennis club. It is a true partner with the City of Chicago to broaden interest in and enjoyment of tennis.

It serves nearly 3,000 students annually through its in-school programs, bringing tennis into CPS schools in at-risk communities, as well as offering after-school and summer camp programs. XSTEF provides full scholarships to CHA residents and income-based scholarships to everyone.
